



John joined Migrant Help in 2013 to lead the charity's work within human trafficking. He is currently the Head of Service for the Human Trafficking and Victims of Slavery Support Services, covering England, Scotland and Northern Ireland. In his role, John works closely with the national as well as devolved governments across the UK. On behalf of Migrant Help, he also leads on a two-year pan-European project on human trafficking.

John is a strong advocate of joint working and has established numerous partnerships across the UK and the EU, including governmental, statutory, NGO, financial sectors, as well as faith based groups. John also works closely with the US Consulate in Scotland and has subsequently established personal networks with the US government's Global Centre for Human Trafficking in Washington DC

Prior to joining Migrant Help, John's career was within the youth justice system both in England and Scotland, working with some of the most vulnerable young people in society. He is also qualified in psychometric testing and analysis of young people with complex substance misuse addictions and behaviours.
